THE GEOGRAPHY OF PHILOSOPHY (GOP) Una exploración interdisciplinaria y transcultural sobre la universalidad y diversidad en conceptos filosóficos fundamentales

El proyecto se propone analizar empírica y conceptualmente tres conceptos filosóficos fundamentales (conocimiento, comprensión y sabiduría) en más de 20 lenguas, principalmente no indoeuropeas, de 8 zonas del mundo: Corea del Sur, Ecuador, Europa Oriental, India, Japón, Marruecos, Perú, Sudáfrica. El objetivo es explorar los elementos conceptuales que pudiera ser universales y culturales, y de qué manera se relacionan entre sí. El proyecto cuenta con investigadores asociados en las universidades de Oxford, Pittsburgh, Rutgers, UCLA y Waterloo, entre otras.
